## H. R. 731.

FEBRUARY 12, 1835.

Read twice, and committed to a Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union.

Mr. McKinley, from the Committee of Ways and Means, reported the following bill:

## A BILL

To establish branches of the Mint of the United States.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That
- 3 three branches of the Mint of the United States be, and the
- 4 same are hereby, established: one at New Orleans, one at
- 5 New York, and one at such place as the Secretary of the
- 6 Treasury may direct, within, or convenient to, the gold region
- 7 of the United States; and that said branch Mints and their
- 8 officers, respectively, shall, in all things, be governed and re-
- 9 gulated by the laws, civil and penal, governing and applica-
- 10 ble to the present Mint of the United States and its officers,
- 11 except so far as may be otherwise directed by this act.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That the branch of
- 2 said Mint to be located within or near the gold region shall
- 3 coin gold only; and every piece which shall be coined thereat
- 4 shall be plainly and distinctly marked with the letters G M;
- 5 and all pieces, whether of gold, silver, or copper, which shall
- 6 be coined at the branch Mint at New Orleans, shall be plainly

- 7 and distinctly marked with the letters SM; and all pieces, whe-
- 8 ther of gold, silver, or copper, which shall be coined at the branch
- 9 Mint at New York, shall be plainly and distinctly marked with
- the letters N M; and all pieces, whether of gold, silver, or cop-
- 11 per, which shall hereafter be coined at the principal Mint at
- 12 Philadelphia, shall be plainly and distinctly marked with the
- 13 letters C M; and the dies for said principal and branch Mints
- 14 shall be prepared accordingly.
  - SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That, from every mass
  - 2 of standard gold or silver which shall be made into coins at
  - 3 either of said branches of the Mint, there shall be taken and
  - 4 set apart by the treasurer thereof, and reserved in his cus-
  - 5 tody, a certain number of pieces, not less than three; and the
  - 6 pieces so set apart and reserved, shall by him be forwarded
  - 7 to the principal Mint at Philadelphia, which pieces shall be
  - 8 assayed at said principal Mint, in every respect, as pieces
  - 9 coined at said principal Mint are by law directed to be as-
- 40 sayed. And it shall be the duty of the Director of the prin-
- 11 cipal Mint to report to the Secretary of the Treasury the ex-
- 12 act result of every such assay.
  - SEC. 4. And be it further enacted, That there shall be
  - 2 appointed for each of said branches of the Mint a director,
  - 3 an assayer, a chief coiner, an engraver, a treasurer, and a
  - 4 melter and refiner; and there shall be allowed and paid, as
  - 5 compensation for their respective services, the following yearly

salaries, to wit: at New Orleans, to the director, three thousand five hundred dollars; to the assayer, two thousand five 7 hundred dollars; to the chief coiner, two thousand five hundred dollars; to the engraver, two thousand two hundred dollars; to the treasurer, two thousand two hundred dollars; to 10 the melter and refiner, two thousand five hundred dollars: at 11 12 the branch Mint for the gold region, to the director, two thou-13 sand five hundred dollars; to the assayer, two thousand dollars; to the chief coiner, two thousand dollars; to the en-14 graver, one thousand eight hundred dollars; to the treasurer, 15 one thousand eight hundred dollars; to the melter and refiner, 16 two thousand dollars: at New York, to the director, three 17 thousand dollars; to the assayer, two thousand two hundred 18 and fifty dollars; to the chief coiner, two thousand two hun-19 dred and fifty dollars; to the engraver, two thousand dollars; 20 to the treasurer, two thousand dollars; to the melter and re-21 finer, two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars; and at 22 Philadelphia, in lieu of their present salaries, to the director, 23 three thousand dollars; to the assayer, two thousand two hun-24 dred and fifty dollars; to the chief coiner, two thousand two 25 hundred and fifty dollars; to the engraver, two thousand dol-26 lars; to the treasurer, two thousand dollars; to the melter 27 and refiner, two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars. 28 Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That there shall be 1 erected, under the direction of the Secretary of the Treasury,

- 3 a plain, substantial building, of suitable dimensions, for the con-
- 4 venient operation of each of said branches of the Mint; and
- 5 for that purpose, and for the purchase of suitable sites for
- 6 each of said buildings and the necessary machinery, for each
- 7 of said branch Mints, the sum of one hundred and forty thou-
- 8 sand dollars is hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any
- 9 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.
- SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That as soon as said
- 2 buildings are completed, and the necessary machinery pur-
- 3 chased, said branch Mints shall go into operation under the
- 4 direction of the Secretary of the Treasury.
